I am very proud of the journey that the school community has been on the past 4.5 years and I believe the school is in a great place at present so I leave for a short term comforted by the fact that the whole school community is working cohesively together. I am very pleased that Miss Jillian Mudford will be relieving as principal in my absence. We met today for a handover. Miss Mudford left very excited and she is looking forward to leading the school community for the remainder of the year.

I have really valued the ongoing support of the P&C and parent community these past 4.5 years. I would like to thank the staff and the very inclusive and kind students of Hurstville Grove for ensuring everyday is full of love, laughter and support as we all learn together, I look forward to seeing you all at Presentation Day and some of the other end of year celebrations.

Merit Selection Process - Permanent Classroom Teacher Position

The classroom teaching position is still in progress and I will continue to lead the panel through this process. The school community will be notified of the successful candidate once the process is complete.

Building Update

OoSH/ Therapy Building

As you are aware the school received a capital works building as a result of the last election. I have been working with architects and the Department of Educations Assets Team to design a building that meets the brief of the election promise to our school community. The design is now being finalised and being submitted to council.

The building has been designed to potentially operate an Out of School Hours care centre (OoSH) that can cater for up to 33 students. Further to this, will be a kitchen that the school community can access for fundraising and community meetings etc. The building will also house a Sensory Therapy room, a smaller therapy/meeting room, a store room and an

accessible bathroom and a student unisex bathroom. This building will be delivered and operational by the end of the financial year in 2020.

December / January Building Works

During the school holidays the school administration building will be removed and upgraded to an 8 modular building inclusive of a sick bay, accessible bathroom, meeting room and a larger staffroom. The school is also entitled to an additional classroom that will sit alongside the administration building. This building project will take place over the December/January school holidays and is due to be handed over to the school on 27th January 2020. The schools neighbours have been informed of this building work by the DoE Assets Team.

Update on the school & P&cPlayground upgrade

The P&C and the SRC have worked very hard this year to fundraise for a playground upgrade inclusive of new equipment, seating and shade. Due to the upcoming building work the school and P&C are not in a position to complete this work until all buildings are installed as the buildings will encroach on the existing playground space. The school has engaged a civil engineer to relocate the containers that are currently on the grass area and to remove the concrete blocks that they sit on to create more space for the students to play. Once all building work is completed the grass area will be levelled and returfed.

Please see below some of the equipment that the students have requested and the prices. This may give families an idea of why the P&C fundraising efforts are so important as the playground equipment will cost approximately \$41,595, seating \$6,000, softfall/synthetic grass \$35,000. Shade will be additional to this.

2020 enrolments

Invitations and information have been sent about our Kindergarten Orientation Program to those families who have enrolled their children to start school in 2020. I expect that we will again have around 35 children in Kindergarten. If you have friends or neighbours living within our school zone who you know will have school age children next year, please encourage them to come to the school to complete the process or call the office on 9580 5361 so we can send them an enrolment package. Any child who turns five years of age before 31 July 2020 is eligible to start school. Participation in the Transition to School Program is the best way to assist children with their start to school.

School Security

School Security and student safety is paramount to our practice. I have arranged with school assets services to install an electronic gate next to the new administration building once the new building is installed. This will ensure all visitors/parents sign in during the school day.

The school would like to remind you that when entering the school after 9:15 am that you must sign in at the office and pick up a Visitors Sticker, (this is not required for whole school events). It is exceptionally important for student safety that we monitor the entry and departure of all school visitors and helpers, (this is inclusive of dropping off drink bottles/jumpers, attending P&C meetings etc). We thank you for working with the school to keep the students safe.

Community Access to bathroom facilities

We appreciate that there are times that you, your child or toddler may need to access the toilet when you are on the school grounds. A reminder that only students are to enter the student toilets. Parents/toddlers may access the Visitor bathroom that is to the left and around the corner from the student bathrooms. Thank you for following this DoE policy and school practice.

Communicating with staff as per the DoE School Community Charter

I would like to reiterate our communication protocols that were outlined in last terms newsletter.

We know that the best education happens when parents and schools work together. It is important that our school is a positive environment and that parents and carers are kept informed of students' progress and school announcements.

While we appreciate the role that support teachers and non teaching staff play in your child's education, to ensure accurate and consistent information about your child's learning and development, the school requests that all communication involving your child and the programs they are involved in are directed to the classroom teacher. Our staff will find a time to talk to you when they can give you their full attention. Please remember that while our staff are in class or dealing with other matters, they may not be available to answer your questions immediately. If your needs are not met with your child's classroom teacher or if the issue/concern is of a more serious nature, we request that you follow this up with a scheduled meeting with the Principal, Miss McKinnon.
