School Uniforms

We are a school community that is very proud of our uniform and our students wear it with pride. The school transitioned from the summer to the **Full winter uniform** during weeks 1 and 2 of Term 2. <u>All students are now required to wear their winter uniform to school.</u>

A reminder of the winter school uniform:

Girls Winter Uniform

- Winter tunic with white long sleeve Peter Pan shirt and **navy** stockings (only),
- Or navy tailored slacks with white long sleeve Peter Pan shirt
- Navy or red school crested zip jacket
- Navy jersey school logo sports shorts or navy tracksuit pants with school logo sports polo shirt

Boys Winter Uniform

- Navy Scags pants with elastic
- Midford Blue long sleeve shirt
- Navy or red school crested zip jacket
- Navy socks
- Navy jersey school logo sports shorts or navy tracksuit pants with school logo sports polo shirt

All year round: HGIS Zip jacket, **HGIS hat**, leather shoes, sports shoes Fridays, school colour hair ties. Navy tracksuit pants are only to be worn for sport on a Friday and leggings are not part of our school uniform.

Please note: all students are required to wear a school navy hat or bucket hat. The red caps are loan hats are for emergencies only. Hats can be purchased from the school office.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data

Another expression of student-centred learning is Hurstville Grove's commitment to providing all students, including those with diverse learning needs, with the very best educational opportunities. Staff work hard to make the school a valued, safe and dynamic learning environment where every student, through challenge and support, can reach their full potential. For students with additional needs, we work collectively with families and allied health professionals to better understand needs, this enables us to strategise and design learning opportunities that offer equitable access to the curriculum.

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports and adjustments provided to students with disabilities. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability. The NCCD has no direct impact on parents or students: there is no additional testing or surveying required. The School curates and provides existing data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student can be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
